NOTICE OF COMPLETION

Madoc Water Supply - New Treatment Plant Option

Schedule C Class Environmental Assessment

The Municipality of Centre Hastings has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study to address water supply challenges in the Village of Madoc and determine a preferred solution for ensuring a reliable municipal drinking water supply to accommodate existing demand and future growth.

The initial Schedule B study, which considered a wide variety of alternative water sources and treatment options, was completed and received final approval on October 2, 2018. The preferred solution was to use a newly developed well as the raw water source and to upgrade the existing Whytock water treatment building to provide both redundant supply and treatment.

A follow-up Schedule C study to reconsider one of the previously unselected treatment options, has now been completed. The preferred solution is to build a new treatment plant adjacent to the new municipal well site and to decommission the Whytock treatment plant.



This study was carried out in accordance with the requirements for a Schedule “C” Municipal Class Environmental Assessment. The planning and decision-making process (including consultation with the public and review agencies, assessment of environmental impacts of alternative solutions, and identification of the preferred solution) has been completed and the environmental study report (ESR) is available for review.
